The success of this event hinges on the support shown by the ILR-SD membership. The Llama Futurity Association, LFA, will be holding their World Futurity, Claims Futurity and Select Auction during the same weekend as The Gathering. The Gathering 2014 QUALIFYING requirements

There is no animal qualifying – just be an ILR-Show Division Member to participate!

To participate in the Supreme Female, Supreme Male, or Supreme Non-Breeder, the llama must have won a Grand Championship at an approved ILR-SD Show during the year since the 2013 Gathering (2013 Gathering and 2014 Gathering are included). To participate in Supreme Advanced Performance, or Supreme Novice Performance the llama must have won a Performance Championship at an approved ILR-SD Show during the year since the 2013 Gathering (2013 Gathering and 2014 Gathering are included).

GATHERING HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

At the time of publication, only a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (Health Certificate) dated within 30 days of the show is required. Have your veterinarian check with Iowa State Veterinarian office for any changes.

ARRIVAL

Wednesday, June 11 – early arrivals after 2:00pm Thursday, June 12 – normal arrival all day and evening

STALLING: Barn floor is cement. All bedding is acceptable **except-no paper bedding, wood chips or cardboard strips.** Stalls are 9'x9'. Limit stalling to 2 larger or 3 juvenile or smaller sized animals per stall. Exhibitors do NOT have to clean stalls at check out.

Farms are encouraged to decorate their areas with the "Swag" of their favorite sports team. The ILR Board will be walking around the barns and will be awarding a prize to the best/most original display!

Office/Clerk desk open Thursday, Friday, Saturday – 7:00 a.m. till 8:00 p.m. Sunday 7:00 a.m. till show end. You MUST check in at the clerk's desk upon arrival.

CAMPING information

Camping is available at the Fairgrounds. It is a few blocks to walk to the stalling/show arena. Most folks will drive from the campground to the show if they have a vehicle that can be separated from their camper. No need to reserve a space ahead of time. There normally is someone on duty, however if you arrive and no one is present, pick out your spot and they will catch up with you.

Bathrooms including showers are available at the campground.

Carts delivered to fairgrounds. You pick them up at the fair security office where you also purchase your permit. Rental Cost for 2-seater \$45 per day, 4-seater \$75 per day and work horse \$105 per day.

You also need permit from IA State Fairgrounds which is \$25 covering 1 to 3 days or \$50 covering over 4 days. This applies if you rent one from Golf Cars of Iowa or if you bring your own machine.

The Gathering 2014 GENERAL Rules:

Exhibitors are required to be ILR-SD members to enter *The Gathering*.

All llamas must be ILR registered for Halter & Fleece Classes. Non-ILR registered or llamas without an ILR listing number may show in the Performance, Showmanship, and Youth divisions after obtaining an ILR Tracking Number. Alpacas can show in *The Gathering* as well. They can show in the Performance, Showmanship and Youth divisions after obtaining an ILR Tacking Number. ILR registration and tracking numbers serve as point trackers for the ILR-SD.

One entry/youth in all youth performance classes. An animal can only go through each Free Style Obstacle, Companion Public Relations, or Trail class one time. Youth age determined by their age on January 1st of 2014, however if a youth reaches the age of 7 between January 1, 2014, and show date, they will be eligible to show as of their birth date.

YOUTH AGES:

• Jr. Youth: 7-11

• Intermediate Youth: 12-15

• Sr. Youth: 16-19

HALTER CLASSES: Age calculated as of June 15, 2014, due to possibility of variance of halter class schedule.

• Juvenile: 5 < 12 months.

• Yearling: 12 < 24 months

• 2 year old: 24 < 36 months

• Adult: over 36 months for llamas

• AGAIN THIS YEAR: Get of Sire class will be TWO animals – they must be shown in halter classes to be used for Get of Sire.

NEW CLASSES FOR 2014:

Supreme Classes: This year we are offering the following classes: Supreme Female, Supreme Male, Supreme Non-Breeder, as well as Supreme Novice Performance, and Supreme Advanced Performance. To be eligible to participate in Supreme Female, Supreme Male and Supreme Non-Breeder, the animal must have earned a Grand Championship at an ILR-SD sanctioned show within the year since the 2013 Gathering (2013 and 2014 Gatherings are included). To be eligible for the Supreme Novice Performance, and Supreme Advanced Performance the animal must have earned a Performance Championship within the year since the 2013 Gathering (2013 and 2014 Gatherings are included). The entry fee for these classes is \$50.00, but the winner of each class will be awarded a cash prize equal to 100% of the entry fees paid for that particular class. Each of these classes will be judged by a three-judge panel.

Scholarship Sweepstakes: The Board of Directors established this class and guaranteed a minimum \$1000.00 purse. The goal of the class is to provide competition for young adults (20-25 years of age as of January 1, 2014) who have become too old to compete in Youth Classes.

The llama must be owned or co-owned by the young adult competing in the class by March 31, 2014 OR the llama must have been shown by the competitor in youth classes prior to 2014.

The class will consist of 10 obstacles, judged by two judges. The judges will be volunteers and not the Gathering judges. The judges must have experience in performance classes and preferably be ILR certified judges. Judges will be selected by the ILR Board of Directors at the Gathering. Relatives of the judges may not compete in the Sweepstakes class. The entry fee for this class is \$15.00 per entry. As a minimum, the top three place will be paid (\$600, \$250, \$100); more places may be paid based on entries and additional Sponsors. If numerous entries are received there may be a preliminary and final round.

All American Llama: This award is for the overall halter, fleece, and performance winner at the Gathering. It is a calculated award: the winner will be determined by totaling the points earned in each class bases on the published ILR point chart. To be eligible to register for this class, the animal must first be registered in the appropriate halter, fleece, and performance classes. For the performance portion, only one performance class will be used. The performance class used will be the performance class yielding the highest total points. For

example, if a llama places 6th, 7th and 3rd in each of their performance classes and each class has 10 animals, then the 3rd place would be used in the calculation for All American Llama. This award will be presented at the ILR Awards Dinner at the Gathering.

Special Composite Award: A special award will be presented this year to the winner of the composite class. To compete for this award, the animal must be entered in Halter, and Fleece-on/Coat-on, and then in the Composite class.

POINTS / AWARDS OTHER THAN GATHERING AWARDS:

Don't forget, all placings at *The Gathering* also count towards UAP and ILR-SD awards. Animals nominated in the Pot of Gold Halter and Performance Futurities for Youth and the Incentive Fund will also receive points for your placing at The Gathering.

ILR-SD HALTER LLAMA FLEECE DESCRIPTIONS: (See Guidelines, Article XI, Halter)

- **Suri:** Fleece exhibits distinct lock formation, hangs straight down from midline, exhibits independent movement, a cool, slick handle and has no crimp. Coverage may vary from light to heavy.
- **Silky:** Fleece exhibits a very soft/silky handle with natural wave, may exhibit some crinkle, but no crimp, has nearly indiscernible guard hair, and has minimal loft and coverage can vary from medium to heavy. Ideally entries exhibit the majority of these criteria
- **Classic/Light Combined:** Mostly double coated with moderate density but short length. Fleece coverage rapidly declines below the elbow/stifle and be very short below the knee/hock. Usually guard hair is longer than the undercoat.
- **Medium:** Llamas may be double coated with moderate density and length. Llama exhibits coverage extending down the leg with minimal coverage below the knee and hock.
- **Moderate Heavy:** Even neck fleece that blends into body fleece of moderate density and length. Legs will exhibit coverage down to the knees and potentially down to the toes with a decline in coverage below the knees on front legs. Rear legs will exhibit coverage down to the pastern on the back of the legs with minimal coverage on the front of the legs.
- **Extreme Heavy:** Will exhibit abundant neck and body fleece. Front legs will exhibit coverage down to the toes maintaining heavy coverage below the knees. Rear legs will exhibit dense coverage down the back of the legs along with fiber on the front side of the legs.

Please enter your animals in their proper wool divisions. The judge will move animals out of the exhibitor-registered division if the animal does not fit with the rest of the animals in the class.

Llama Fleece-On/Coat-On Fiber Classes will be held in a specified area and judged individually. Time to be announced.

Shorn Fiber and Specialty/Products entries must be turned in by 8:00 pm Thursday evening, June 12th.

The Gathering 2014 FOR the FUN of IT Events:

ILR AWARDS PICNIC

The ILR Board and retiring Board members will be serving a picnic and presiding over the Annual Awards Ceremony. This is an event that you won't want to miss. Each registered farm will receive one complementary ticket for the picnic. Additional tickets may be purchased for \$10.00 each at the time of registration or at check in.

TRADITIONAL SILENT AUCTION

You will be able to bid on donated items using either your name or your ILR owner code number. It's best to keep an eye on the bidding sheet for any item you want to make sure your have the last and highest bid. There will be a preannounced cut off time ending the auction. Whoever has the highest bid on the item at the end of the auction will be the winner.

Criteria: Fleece product MUST be entered in the Fleece Product division for judging.

Judging: Judging of the fleece products is to be done as soon as possible on Friday to allow maximum time for items to be on display.

After the fleece products are judged, all fleece products will be in the People's Choice Award Contest and will be on display. Individual names or farm names will not be attached to the product. Each product entered will be assigned a number. Exhibitors and visitors may vote, only once, for the Finished Fleece Product they feel should be the "People's Choice" based on the creativity of the finished product, and what catches their eye. Cast a vote by filling out a ballot and placing in the ballot box located by the People's Choice Award display.

Winner will be announced at the ILR Awards Picnic and awarded with ribbons for Fleece On. Finished Fleece Products and Shorn Fleece may be picked up after the awards are announced Saturday evening.

TREATS AND TREASURES

Tables will be set up for people to bring "goodies" (baked or otherwise) for sale. We are thinking healthy for 2014, so Fruits and Vegetables are welcome. These will be out starting on Friday morning for people to purchase. All proceeds will go to the ILR. Items could include cookies, bars, fruits, breads, candies, caramel corn, cheese curds, etc.

Additionally, items for which a person no longer has a use, wants, or simply needs to eliminate from their barn, will be put on display for sale. People can purchase them for a nominal charge and all proceeds will also go to the ILR. This can be leads, halters, brushes, grooming aids, nail trimmers, show clothing articles, cria coats, tie outs, knickknacks, knitting supplies, spinning supplies, display boards, hangers for banners or posters, basically anything that is portable and could be useful to someone else.

Please no hard to transport items.

PEOPLE'S CHOICE PHOTO CONTEST

Exhibitors and visitors will vote on the best photograph in each category. These photos will be on display the entire weekend and the winner will be announced on Sunday. All photos become property of the ILR to be used for promotion.

YOUTH GATHERING DOLLARS

- Youth receive points for any placings at ILR-SD shows during the 2013 year.
- Each point will be \$10.00 in Gathering Dollars. Gathering dollars are NOT real money, but rather "funny money" or "play money".
- If a Pot of Gold animal was used in earning those points the points will be double value.
- Youth can earn extra Gathering Dollars at the 2014 Gathering event by volunteering to help at the show in various areas. Exhibitors or visitors can purchase Gathering Dollars at the value to give to youth that they feel are deserving for any reason of receiving those dollars, i.e.: well mannered, well dressed, helpful, friendly, etc. A \$10.00 donation will purchase \$100 in Gathering dollars.
- Youth will receive a bonus of \$100 Gathering Dollars for each class they enter at the 2014 Gathering event.
- All youth Gathering Dollars earned up to the time of the event will be in the exhibitor packets at the 2014 Gathering event in June of 2014.
- Gathering Dollars earned will be for youth to purchase donated items at the YOUTH ONLY AUCTION to be held on Saturday evening at the 2014 *International Gathering of Friends and Champions*.
