ENTRY DEADLINE: 8/22/2025

All entries must be submitted no later than Friday, August 22, 2025. **Substitutions** should be presented to the Superintendent prior to the show, with a maximum of three per exhibitor allowed at no charge. Additional substitutions will be charged the entry fee.

ENTRY FEES - All DOUBLE SHOW (Two judges one fee)

\$30 per llama for double halter class.

\$20 Adult Showmanship

\$20 Novice, Advanced; for double performance class.

\$45 DEAL (Class 701) must enter all 3 performance classes.

\$0 Youth Showmanship all levels

\$8 Youth: (Jr, Inter, Sr.;) for each double performance class.

\$8 Youth: (Sub-Junior;) for each double performance class.

\$20 per llama for double judged Fleece on/Coat on.

\$20 for double judged shorn or fiber products.

SPECIAL THIS YEAR

For any animal that's entered in a class (Fleece On/Coat On, Halter or any of the 3 Performance classes) that SAME animal's fiber can be entered in **Shorn Fleece class 601** for just \$10.

\$6 ILR-SD fee for each Ilama entered in the show. This includes Ilamas not registered with ILR.

THERE ARE NO PEN/STALL FEES. Straw bedding provided.

Due to limited space, consider doubling animals in pens. When tallying pens/stalls please list by gender and type of pen/stall preferred. *Choice of:*

- Open panel pens for females, geldings, juveniles.
- Solid sided (back & sides) open front (half wall/upper barred) horse stall studs and females with cria

ARRIVAL AND RELEASE TIMES

Move-in Friday, August 29, 2025 from 7AM – 3PM.

[If you need to arrive on Thursday you MUST contact the superintendent when you register for prior approval.]

Animals will be released Monday, September 1st at 7pm.

[An earlier release time can be negotiated with the superintendent on a sliding time frame depending on exhibitor's travel distance after 2pm. Exhibitor MUST see superintendent for this early release slip.]

There will be no staging of trucks and trailers on the grounds.

EXHIBITOR PASSES

1 to 6 llamas 3 daily admission passes & 2 parking passes, 7 to 12 llamas 4 daily admission passes & 3 parking passes, 13 or more llamas 5 admission passes & 4 parking passes

All General and Livestock Department Rules apply. Please read them.

APPLICABLE SHOW RULES

This show is sanctioned under the ILR-SD. It is the responsibility of exhibitors to be familiar with the show rules. They can be found at <u>www.lamaregistry.com</u>.

Entry must be made in the exact name of the owner and animal, as shown on the registration certificate. For youth classes please make sure the handler is also identified.

A photocopy of registration certificates must be brought to the Fair.

Out of state animals must have health papers with a copy to turn in to the fair livestock office.

Participants are encouraged to enter as many divisions as desired, but **no Exhibitor will be allowed more than two (2) premiums in any one class. Late entries are not allowed.**

Shorn/Skeins/Finished Goods entries may be delivered to the Fair Friday, August 29th from 9am – 3pm. To mail entries, call 503-930-9936 for information. If mailed the exhibitor must provide return postage and packaging, otherwise items can be retrieved upon move out on Monday. *ALL ENTRIES MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY ENTRY TAG LOCATED ONLINE WITH LLAMA HANDBOOK.*

PERFORMANCE CLASS - DOUBLE SHOW - APPLICABLE CLASS RULES

Exhibitors should read the ILR-SD Performance Rules.

NOVICE: Open to llamas or alpacas who have NOT earned sufficient points to be moved to the advanced division. Points awarded to the animal.

ADVANCED: Open to llamas and alpacas who HAVE earned sufficient points in the novice division that they are required to compete in Advanced Classes. Points awarded to the animal.

YOUTH CLASS RULES

Youth age divisions may be combined if there are insufficient entries. A youth exhibitor may also enter advanced or novice performance classes **but must use a different animal than used in the youth classes**.

SUB JUNIOR: Open to those under 7, adult must be in attendance. No premiums, but ribbons and prizes!

JUNIOR: Open to handlers aged 7 – 11 years on January 1, 2025 or who turned 7 years of age prior to the show date. Points awarded to the handler.

INTERMEDIATE: Open to handlers aged 12 – 14 years on January 1, 2025. Points awarded to the handler.

SENIOR: Open to handlers aged 15 – 18 years on January 1, 2025. Points awarded to the handler.

Champion and Reserve Champion:

Animals must be shown in all three of the following classes: Pack, Public Relations and Obstacle.

Premiums and awards are based on tabulated scores from the 3 classes.

Champion and ribbons for 1st - 5th from both judges

Champion and Reserve Champion

Grand and Reserve Champions are tabulated from the combined points from:

1) Obstacle and Public Relations (these 2 classes are required for the Champion awards.)

AND either

2) Showmanship *or* Pack/Trail - whichever score is higher. You're encouraged to enter both as your highest score will go toward the points for the award.

SUB – JUNIOR

Ribbons from Oregon State Fair 1st -5th and donated special prizes for Champion, Reserve Champion and Rosettes. Please contact superintendent if able to help sponsor this age group.

HALTER CLASS- DOUBLE SHOW - APPLICABLE CLASS RULES

Exhibitors should read the ILR-SD Halter Rules Halter classes may be combined, if needed, by age or fiber as per Judge's or superintendent's discretion.

Ribbons for 1st - 5th from both judges for each class.

Llamas are judged on soundness and confirmation. On a llama's birth date, they move up to the next older class. Points are awarded to the llama.

GET OF SIRE: Each entry must include 2 offspring by the same sire.

BREEDERS PAIR: Each entry includes 2 animals that were bred and raised by the owner.

OREGON STATE FAIR AWARD: Each entry must include 2 animals. Both animals must have been bred and raised in Oregon.

BEST OF SHOW: All halter breeding champions of both judges. Each judge will make their own choice.

PREMIER EXHIBITOR BANNER: A banner will be given to the exhibitor who accumulates the most points from the placing of 6 or fewer animals owned and exhibited by the exhibitor regardless of breeder.

PREMIER BREEDER BANNER: A banner will be given to the breeder who accumulates the most points from the placing of 6 or fewer animals bred and exhibited either by the breeder or other exhibitors.

State Fair Livestock Gates Security & Ticketing Information:

Exhibitors remain responsible for complying with the OSF rules, policies, and regulations, as currently drafted. OSFEC has the right to amend them from time to time.

Again in 2025, there will continue to be two manned gates to enter through to the livestock areas of the state fair grounds. One is located at the east end of the horse show barn stalls for all foot traffic. There will also be a gate for vehicle entry and exit, and to allow horses only through. The gate will close at 9AM each morning to all vehicle traffic.

The other gate is the Grey Gate. This will be open for foot traffic, but will also close at 9AM for all vehicle traffic.

Security will be at both walk through gates at 6AM each day. There will be metal detectors like last year at both gates. This year the staff manning these gates will also have a ticket scanner to scan *pre-purchased* one day tickets to help ease the pain entering without an Ag/livestock bracelet. Fairgoers *will NOT* be able to purchase tickets at either gate if they don't already have a <u>pre-purchased</u> ticket or wrist band and will have to go to blue gate to do so.

You will be wanded by the staff manning the gates upon entering at either gate. Bags will also be searched at these locations so please allow extra time so that we can keep the state fair safe for everyone.

There will be no vehicle traffic on the west side of the Forester Livestock Pavilion after 9AM each day. Parking officials will help you transport anything needed west of the pavilion during the day.

No vehicles can be left on the grounds near all barns after 9AM and is subject to towing with no questions asked.

Poultry and Rabbits and their supplies will be shuttled over to the Poultry building each day as needed.
